Describe clothes worn a long time ago • Suggest what is different about Grace Darling's clothes from clothes worn by women of all generations today • Recognise what is different about Grace Darling's life from their own lives Each child writes a letter to a friend about their day in the lighthouse, either as Grace Darling or one of her brothers or sisters. Encourage children to ensure that they include details that show the letter is from the Victorian times. Tea stained letters. What did she do to become famous? Newspaper report. Encourage the children to think about what the word 'famous' means. Who do they know who is famous? Why is he or she famous? What other famous people from the past do they know about? What did they do to become famous? How do we find out about famous people?
