English

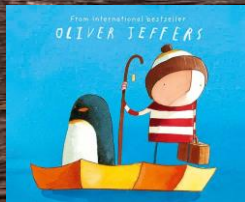
We will be:

Reading:

We will be working on our reading accuracy and fluency through Read Write Inc. and VIPERS reading comprehension tasks.

We will work on applying phonic knowledge, segmenting and sound-blending skills to tackle texts with increasing independence

Maths

We will be:

- counting and comparing and ordering numbers to 100.
- Reading and writing numbers to 100 in numerals and words.
- Partitioning numbers into tens and ones.

Science

We will

- Asking scientific questions and recognise that these can be answered in different ways.
- Observing and using simple equipment.
- Performing simple tests.
- Identifying and Classifying
- Identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard.
- Finding out how the shapes of solid objects (made from some materials) can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.

Art

We will be-Using primary colours to make secondary colours.

- Looking at and exploring the artist Mondrian.
- We will be Creating our own art work in the style of Mondrian.



Geography

We will be:

- Learning the names and locations of the seven continents and five oceans
- Learning the names and locations of the five nations of the United Kingdom.
- Using simple compass directions.
- Investigating a range of human and physical features of seaside locations.



RE

Our unit this half term focuses on the Jewish belief in 'Teshuvah', translated as 'repentance' or 'return' and including a sense of regret, making amends and not doing the particular thing wrong again. This belief is formalised in the High Holy Days each year when the ten days of 'return' offer the chance to put things right with others and, on Yom Kippur, the chance to be forgiven by God.
