English

We continue to build on our knowledge of sentence writing using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. We will be practising how to write questions using question marks at the end of a sentence. We will continue to use our knowledge of phonics to help with our writing as well as becoming more confident in spelling and using common exception words.

Reading

We will continue to build our phonics knowledge and skills through our Read Write Inc. programme as well as practise our comprehension and inference skills when we share our high quality class stories or read 1:1 with a grown up.

Maths

Place value within 50, adding and subtracting, length and height, mass and volume.

We build on our knowledge of place value within 20 to stretch this to within 50. We then explore and investigate measuring in length, height, mass and volume.

Science

Who's who in the animal world?
We continue our investigations into the animal world by learning more about reptiles and amphibians as well as exploring how animals adapt to survive in different environments.
