

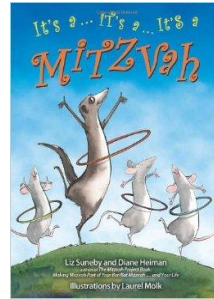
Year 1: Why is learning to do **good deeds** so important to Jewish people?

Key Concept: Mitzvot (Good deeds)

What should we know?

- Jewish people believe that God gave them commandments - Mitzvah
- Performing Mitzvot brings Jewish people closer to God and creates a sense of community.
- Tzedakah (charity) is important to Jewish families
- Tikkum Olam (repairing the world) is an important part of performing Mitzvot



What should we be able to do?

- ✓ **Enquire** into how Mitzvot make Jewish people feel they belong to God
- ✓ **Explore** mitzvot in a Bible Story
- ✓ **Recall** key points from the story of Ruth that help Jewish people to learn about the importance of Mitzvah
- ✓ **Ask questions** about the story and explore different ideas it raises.
