

Year 4: What is the **Trinity**?

In KS1:

Christians are followers of Jesus, the saviour of the world. He died at Easter but came back to life.

Jesus told parables to teach about God.

Christians pray to God and worship him in different ways.

The Holy Spirit reminds Christians God is always with them.

Key Concept: INCARNATION

What should we know?

Christians struggle to express the idea of the Trinity. It is a mystery.

Christians believe:

- Christians believe in one God but they experience Him in three ways (Father, Son, Holy Spirit).
- When Jesus was baptised all three persons of the Trinity were present.
- Jesus, the son of God, is seen as revealing what God the Father is like.
- The Holy Spirit is God's power at work in the world and in their lives today, enabling them to follow Jesus.

Holy Spirit	Christians believe that the Holy Spirit is God's power or enabler.
