





<b>Year Group: 5</b>	<b>Term: Spring</b>	<b>Topic: Verbs in a week</b>
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**Must Have Knowledge:**

- To know the French infinitive form of the regular verbs – to play (jouer) to swim (nager) and to eat (manger)
- To know how to say I like (j'aime) and I don't like (Je n'aime pas) in French
- To know that 'to be' (etre) and 'to have' (avoir) are irregular verbs

être - to be	
Je suis	I am
Tu es	You are (singular and informal)
Il est	He is
Elle est	She is
Nous sommes	We are
Vous êtes	You are (Plural or singular formal)
Ils sont	They are (Masculine plural)
Elles sont	They are (feminine plural)

avoir - to have	
J'ai	I have
Tu as	You have (singular and informal)
Il a	He/It has
Elle a	She/It has
Nous avons	We have
Vous avez	You have (Plural or singular formal)
Ils ont	They have (Masculine plural)
Elles ont	They have (feminine plural)
