**Must Have Knowledge:**

- To know that the near future tense is formed by using the present tense of the verb aller + the infinitive, e.g. je vais manger – I am going to eat.
- To know the prepositions ‘en (feminine)’ ‘au’ (masculine) and ‘aux’ (plural) are used when you go to a country.
- To know the words L’Angleterre (England) and La France (France)

**Key Vocabulary:**

Aller - To go	
Je vais	I go/I am going
Tu vas	you go/you are going
Il va/ elle va	he goes/he is going/she goes/she is going
Nous allons	we go/we are going
Vous allez	you go/you are going
Ils vont/elles vont	they go/they are going (masc/fem)

Preposition use with countries depends on the gender

Je vais	I'm going	
au Canada (m)	en France (f)	aux États-Unis (pl)
to Canada	to France	to USA
